## Steps to follow for a Lab Confirmed COVID - 19 Student Case

Defining exposure to COVID - 19 = 1) someone that lives in the same household as the confirmed case, 2) being within 6 feet of a person for 15 minutes without the use of a face covering, or 3) being in direct contact with secretions from the lab confirmed case.

Student tests positive for COVID - 19. → Family should notify the campus and remain home for 10 days. → Campus identifies and notifies any other student or staff member that was in close contact. → Student may return to campus after 10 days have passed; at least one day has passed with no temperature without the use of medication; student has improved symptoms.

Student reports experiencing symptom(s) of COVID - 19 during the school day. → Student will be examined in isolated area. → School nurse will determine if student can remain at school or needs to be sent home based on TEA guidance. → Any other student(s) living in the household could be sent home as well. → May return to school after completing the stay at home requirements or a negative test.

Student reports someone at home has symptoms or has tested positive for COVID - 19. → Student has prolonged exposure to COVID - 19 and should remain off campus. → If student is already on campus when school is notified, student should follow isolation protocol. → Student may return to campus after 14 days have passed; at least one day has passed with no temperature without the use of medication; student has improved symptoms.

Student reports someone in their home has been exposed to someone who has tested positive. → If the family member is not symptomatic and exposed only, student should contact physician, but may attend school.

All students and staff who were exposed to a lab confirmed case should remain off campus for 14 days from the exposure.

## Steps to follow for a Lab Confirmed COVID - 19 Employee Case

Defining exposure to COVID - 19 = 1) someone that lives in the same household as the confirmed case, 2) being within 6 feet of a person for 15 minutes without the use of a face covering, or 3) being in direct contact with secretions from the lab confirmed case.

Employee that test positive for COVID - 19.



Report positive case to supervisor.



Employee may return to campus after 10 days have passed; at least one day has passed with no temperature without the use of medication; has improved symptoms.

Employee reports experiencing symptom(s) of COVID - 19 during the school day.



Employee will be examined in isolated area.



School nurse will determine if employee can remain at school or needs to be sent home based on TEA guidance.



May return to school after completing the stay at home requirements or a negative test.

Employee reports someone at home has symptoms or has tested positive for COVID - 19.



Employee should contact supervisor.



Employee has prolonged exposure to COVID -19 and should remain off campus.



If employee is already on campus when notified, employee should follow isolation protocol.

Employee reports someone in their home has been exposed to someone who has tested positive.



If the family member is not symptomatic and exposed only, employee should contact physician, but may attend school.

All students and staff who were exposed to a lab confirmed case should remain off campus for 14 days from the exposure.
